The charity is an unincorporated association governed by the Objects and Rules of the Friends of Fulbourn Hospital & the Community which were amended at the AGM in October 2020.

The Annual Accounts are independently examined and approved by the Management Committee before their presentation at the AGM.

The policy on unrestricted non-designated reserves is to hold at least £1,000.

As at 31 March 2021, the reserves held were:

- designated Investment reserves at cost £113,515
- restricted reserves 1,047
- unrestricted reserves £2,182

The charity trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on <u>public</u> <u>benefit</u> published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers or duties.

The <u>Object</u> of the Friends shall be to relieve patients and former patients of the Fulbourn Hospital, who are sick, convalescent, disabled, handicapped, infirm, or in need of financial assistance, and generally to support the charitable work of the said Hospital.

In year under review the <u>activities</u> of the charity have covered:

<u>Fellowship</u> by providing financial and other support to the Living Room, the Forum Lunch Club, the Pottery Group and the Thank You Week event for CPFT volunteers were not held on account of the covid restrictions.

<u>Grants</u> have been given to individuals were maintained and on account of demand had to be supplemented by some being jointly funded with Cambridge Aid.

<u>Wards</u> have been supported in a variety of ways including by distributing Christmas presents donated by SCDC, which thanks to the continuing commitment of SCDC staff continued despite the covid restrictions.
